


Humber Funeral Service Education: 2021 Continuing Education



Executor Advisor Training

Come on, we're all professionals in the bereavement sector. We help people deal with the death of a loved one every day. But how many times do we not discuss the estate of the deceased, other than to ask, "Did your dad have a Will? And who is listed on that Will as his Estate Trustee?"

The public looks to us as being the 'death-care experts', and in their eyes that includes the often complex world of estates. But how many of us really know anything about that world, other than 'am I making arrangements with the correct individual', and 'These Proof of Death certificates will be useful for banking and insurance purposes.'

This 2-hour session will look at the language used, and how things have changed for the executor in the last couple of decades so that the bereavement professional can have more confidence speaking with our families on this topic.

Reflecting Indigenous Peoples' perspective on the relationship they have with those who came to their land generations ago, the information is presented with a refreshing tone of love, forgiveness and a keen desire to take steps toward a bright future together.

Being that this training is one that has been mandated by the federal government, we are hopeful that all our nation's bereavement professionals from coast, to coast, to coast will complete it while it is being offered by Humber's FSE-CE. We see no better way to demonstrate to our communities our level of empathy and our professionalism as death care providers than to be able to say we undertook this as a priority.
